#### **History from the 1975 Church Directory**

The Church of Christ at Hamilton first started meeting in 1897. The first Christians here met in homes from 1897 to 1905. At that time, only about two or three families of the Church of Christ lived in Hamilton. In 1905, brother Johnson and his family moved to Hamilton. He was employed as a teacher at the West Alabama Agriculture School and was called by his students and fellow teachers "Professor Johnson." The church then began to meet in the courthouse and continued to meet there until 1912. The Johnsons moved away. In the meantime, a wooden building was started in 1907 but was not finished for several years.

From about 1912-1913, the church did not meet. The building was completed enough by 1913 for the church to start meeting. At that time, there was not a male church member in Hamilton. Princie Mills and sister C. R. Franks were the only two members. At that time, brother Cliff Mills was not a member. Brother J. G. Malphurs came in 1913. With the help of brother Fannon Lambert, the one-room wooden building was completed. The Dillard family moved here in 1918. Later, the John Haney family moved here. Some early preachers who preached and held meetings were: brother John Hudson, brother Lancaster, brother Dyes, brother Wallace, brother H. Leo Boles, brother C. R. Nichol, brother G. A. Dunn, Jr., brother W. A. Black, brother

A. B. Lipscomb, and others.

From 1913-1925, there were no elders in the congregation. Then, brethren Cliff Mills, John Haney, J. L. Jackson, and A. R. Britton were appointed elders. Brother W. A. Holley moved to Guin and preached monthly for the church in Hamilton two Sundays and Guin two Sundays a month. Brother Jimmy Powell was the first located preacher to live and work with the church in Hamilton. He stayed here from 1947-1949. He was followed by brother Edsel Burleson who stayed until 1952. Brother [Blanton] Swindle followed him and stayed two years. Brother [Edsel] Burleson came back to Hamilton and stayed until 1962. Brother Jerry Jenkins followed brother Burleson and stayed until 1966. Truman Keith worked with the church for a year [1966]. He was followed by brother Levi Sides, who worked with the church until 1970. Brother W. T. Allison came in 1970. The church is presently [1975] served by five elders: Ross Feltman, Howard Mays, Cliff Mills, L. L. Moore, and Caster Williams.

About 1922, the old wooden building was torn down, and a brick building was erected. The members did all the work of the building, except for laying the brick. It consisted only of an auditorium. Then, in 1925, some classrooms were added. In 1960, a new 550-seat auditorium was completed. The church presently [1975] has about 350-400 for Sunday morning worship. Some 300-225 meet for Bible classes in 23 different classrooms. God has been good to us, and we give Him the glory!



We had a great time at the Ballard's last week! Seeing the youth group get together for another time of praise on Sunday brings encouragement to all of us. When a church has young people who strive for the Lord, a sense of hope fills us all. These devotionals give our kids an opportunity to grow closer to God. It is families like the Ballard's who make this possible and we cannot thank them enough!
